Kats Korner

At Vermont Value Vet we understand that cats need a little quiet and comfort to relax, especially when they may be feeling under the weather. We have created our dedicated Kats Korner to provide a comforting environment for all our feline patients.

We have a separate cat consult room, and provide Feliway, a calming pheromone that cats prefer, to ensure that there are no frightening canine odours in the consult room. The customized cat weigh scale allows cats to be weighed in the comfort and security of the consult room with their owners present – avoiding a scary public weigh-in in the waiting room. We can provide appointments at "dog free" times upon request – we ask that you speak to the receptionist about your cat's preference for a "dog free" appointment time when you make your booking.

If your cat needs to stay at Vermont Value Vet, perhaps for a dental procedure or surgery, we provide a separate hospital ward for feline patients. With smaller cages, snug beds and no noisy canines, cats can feel secure and protected during their stay.

At Vermont Value Vet we ensure that your cat is in optimal health by using feline specific laboratory tests should your cat require a blood test. We have dental equipment designed for cats' smaller mouths and teeth, and special xray plates for delicate feline bones and slim frames.

To help you take the best care of your cat at home we provide veterinary advice on a wide range of feline diets including Hills, Eukanuba and IAMS. Vermont Value Vet stocks prescription diets that care for a range of medical conditions, including obesity, diabetes, renal disease, urinary crystals, skin problems and dental care. If you are finding it hard to find a particular variety that your cat needs, we may be able to stock it for you. By calling or emailing ahead with your cats requirements we can ensure that we will have your order in stock for you at each visit.

You may decide to keep your cat indoors, or to allow your cat safe, supervised access to the outdoors. For our clients who prefer to keep their cat indoors and away from fast cars, loose dogs and nasty viruses, we recommend Catnap Enclosures. (For further information on Catnap Enclosures please call Vermont Value Vet). Whichever lifestyle you choose for your cat, we will recommend an appropriate vaccination schedule.

Every cat should receive an annual vaccination against the three most common feline viruses:

Cat Calicivirus – protects against cat 'flu'

Cat Rhinotracheitis Virus – protects against cat 'flu'

Cat Panleukoapenia Virus – protects against gastroenteritis

Cat Chlamydia – protects against conjunctivitis and sinusitis

For cats that access the outdoors we also recommend vaccination against Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV). This provides protection against Feline AIDS. It is recommended that cats are microchipped and provided with permanent identification before this vaccination.

We are also able to provide the Cat Leukaemia vaccination on request – please speak to the vet for more information.

Before Dr Hugh Bourke commenced at Vermont Value Vet, he worked in London where he was the West London Cats Protection League's vet for nine years. They were responsible for the treatment and rehoming of up to 1500 cats and kittens per year, so his experience with felines is extensive. Dr Jakob Hayes holds a post graduate qualification in small animal surgery, and is able to tackle many difficult surgical procedures that cats can present with.
